A CITY WITH SO MUCH TO SEE AND DO

Delhi is steeped in history and very alive to the present. From the imposing Red Fort and the pure white Lotus Temple to the busy streets of Chandni Chowk and the very popular Lodi gardens, Delhi is a treasure trove of historical wonders, and pulsating street life. The busy markets of Delhi are a mix of tradition and modernity, where centuries-old bazaars coexist with contemporary shopping arcades. From the gulleys of old Delhi markets, with time-worn spice shops and ornamental treasures, to the chic boutiques of Khan Market, they offer an enthralling experience. Shopping is an artform for Dilliwalas, bargaining in the lanes of Sarojini Nagar for fashion steals, visiting Dilli Haat for regional cuisine and handcrafted wonders, and the glitter of modern malls for indulgences.

On the other hand, Delhi offers a fascinating journey through time with Delhi's museum trail. Each museum is an incredible repository, where ancient civilisations and the imprints of colonial rule resonate with the vitality of contemporary India. The National Museum, with its exquisite artefacts, speaks of India's artistic heritage, the National Gallery of Modern Art is where avant-garde melds with tradition, while the Red Fort Archaeological Museum reveals tales hidden within the walls of a Mughal architecture. The Indian War Memorial Museum honours the nation's valour, while the National Handicrafts and Handlooms Museum showcases the artistic genius of India's diverse regions.



TOP 5 EXPERIENCES IN DELHI



India Gate

India Gate, in the heart of Delhi, stands as a tribute to the sacrifice of Indian soldiers who laid down their lives in World War I. Designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens, this majestic monument has recently undergone a revitalisation, adding contemporary amenities to its historic grandeur. The surrounding area has been artfully transformed, with refurbished green spaces, walking promenades, and illuminated water bodies. Just behind India Gate, the National War Memorial, inaugurated in 2019, stands as a reminder of the gallantry of Indian armed forces. Visible across the expanse is the Rashtrapati Bhavan, the presidential residence, in all its architectural splendour.

Jantar Mantar

Jantar Mantar is a fascinating blend of history and scientific ingenuity. Built in 1724 by Maharaja Jai Singh, It is a celestial observatory, a testament to the remarkable skills of ancient Indian astronomers. It transports you back in time as you wander through its labyrinth of precision-engineered instruments, each designed to track the movements of the sun, moon, and stars. The sundials, celestial globes, and astronomical instruments create an intriguing story of India's rich scientific heritage.





Akshardham Temple

Akshardham Temple, built in 2005, stands at a height of 140 ft. in pink sandstone and marble, amidst meticulously landscaped lawns, water bodies, and courtyards, all designed with Hindu architectural principles of vaastu shastra, and pancharatra shastra. There are intricate carvings on its walls and boasts a remarkable musical fountain, where the Sahaj Anand Water Show takes place, a delightful Light and Sound Show narrating ancient Hindu tales. The temple holds 234 exquisitely carved pillars and nine inscribed domes and around 20,000 idols of Hindu deities, with the central shrine dedicated to Lord Swaminarayan. It has ten gates symbolising the ten directions, with the Bhakti Dwar serving as the primary entrance.

Bahai Lotus Temple

Designed in the shape of a gigantic blooming lotus flower with 27 white marble petals, the Lotus Temple is not just an iconic structure but also a symbol of unity and harmony. It welcomes all faiths, regardless of gender, to partake in its message of unity and solace. When you step inside, it offers a profound sense of peace, inner reflection and spiritual tranquility. Its gleaming white marble exterior, surrounded by green gardens, creates a stunning contrast to the hubbub of Delhi just beyond it.

ANCIENT WONDERS OF A 4 BILLION-YEAR-OLD VILLAGE IN KARNATAKA



Anegundi

Surrounded by the Tungabhadra River on one side and by majestic hills on three others, this village, older than its famous neighbour Hampi, lies in the mythical kingdom of Kishkinda, ruled by the monkey king Sugriva (from the Epic Ramayana). The Anjaneya Hill, visible from the hilltop, is believed to be the birthplace of the monkey god Hanuman. Anegundi, meaning "elephant pit" in Kannada, holds the prestigious title of being the first capital of the Vijayanagara Empire.

As a World Heritage Site, Its historical monuments and revered temples are protected and preserved by the Archaeological Survey of India. Anegundi's historical significance surpasses even the ancient, with Maurya Mane and Onake Kindi, two prehistoric era clusters dating back thousands of years, with evidence of cave and rock paintings. Remarkably, geologists estimate this land to be approximately four billion years old.





Things to do:

- **Explore:** Visit the many well-preserved temples and historical sites, like the Ganesha Cave temple, Durga temple, Pampa Sarovar, Anegundi Fort, and Onake Kindi Cave Paintings.
- Hiking and Trekking: Explore the surrounding hills by going on hikes and treks.
- Culture: Interact with the friendly local community to learn about the traditions and way of life in rural Karnataka.
- ▶ Yoga and Meditation: Experience peace with yoga and meditation in natural surroundings.
- ▶ Stargazing: On clear dark nights, indulge in stargazing.
- ▶ Nature Walks: Take leisurely nature walks spotting local flora and fauna and enjoying the fresh air, or a boatride along the picturesque Tungabhadra River.
- ▶ Photography: Capture the magical landscapes, ancient architecture, and local life.
- ▶ **Shopping:** Shop for local handicrafts, artwork, and souvenirs.
