Abstract

Tourism—Declaring Tourism as an Industry—Orders—Issued

ORDER

The Government of India, with a view to developing tourism in the State, have suggested that Tourism be declared as an "industry". Government after considering all the aspects of the case are pleased to accept this recommendation and hereby order that 'Tourism' will be treated as an 'Industry'. This will enable those engaged in tourism promotional activities in the State to become automatically eligible for the concessions/incentives as applicable to the industrial sector from time to time.

- 2. The concessions available to the towrism sector will be the following:
 - (i) Subsidy for preparation of feasibility/project report.
 - (ii) Investment subsidy limited to 10% thereof.
 - (iii) Incenti e for training local menpower.
 - (iv) Augmenting availability of funds from State Financial Corporations.
 - (v) Concess on in electricity and water charges.

- (vi) Allocation of land at concessional rate.
- (vii) Exemption from building tax levied by the Revenue Department (Action to amend the Kerala Buildings Tax Act 1975 will be taken separately).
- 3. The spread-over time for workers engaged in the units eligible for the concessions mentioned above will be raised to 14 hours a day as against the existing 10,30 hours. The restrictions on employment of women will be removed. There will not be any discrimination in regard to emoluments between men and women. Government in the Labour Department will sue the necessary orders granting exemption in this behalf.
- 4. For investment subsidy a new detailed sub head will be opened under the nead of account "339 Tourism". An amount of Rs. 25 lakhs will be provided under this head of account during the year 1987-88. Orders in this behalf will be issued from the Finance (B.W) Department.
 - 5. The ingredients eligible for the concessions mentioned above will be:
 - (i) Classified hotels (1 to 5 star)
 - (ii) Motels (which conform to the specifications of the Department of Tourism of Kerala/Central Government).
 - (iii) Restaurants (approved by classification Committee of the Government of India).
 - (iv) Amusement Parks and Recreation Centres approved by the Government.
 - (v) Ropeways at tourist centres.
 - (vi) Purchase of luxury cars, coaches, boats, aircrafts etc. by Tour Operators approved by the State/Central Department of Tourism.
 - (vii) Construction of structures like Koothambalam/Auditorium etc. by Schools/Institutions teaching Kalaripayattu and traditional art forms of Kerala.
 - (viii) Institutions teaching surfing, skiing, gliding, trekking and similar activities which will promote tourism.
 - (ix) Ayurvedic centres with tourism potential.
 - (x) Building of traditional types of boats like Chundan, Iruttukuthy, Veppu, Kettuvallam and House boats.
 - (xi) Exclusive handicrafts emporia (approved by the State/Central Department of Tourism).

Hotels within the Corporation Innits of Trivandrum, Cochin and Calicut will not be eligible for investment subsidy. They will, however, be entitled to the other benefits provided by these orders. Those ingredients which are getting, any form of subsidy from any other department of the State Government will not be eligible for subsidy under this scheme.

- 6. A Committee consisting of the following officers is constituted to look into the applications for benefits received under this scheme and to decide on the eligibility, quantum of concession etc. payable under the new scheme in each case.
 - (i) Additional Chief Secretary to Government—Chairman
 - (ii) Secretary to Government (Industries) Member
 - (iii) Director, Department of Tourism-Convener

The applications for concessions will be placed before this committee for decision. The Committee will also have powers to decide thether any ingredient not included in para 5 above is to be extended the benefits contemplated under this scheme.
