CENTRALLY SPONSORED SCHEMES FOR WEST BENGAL

2780. DR. SUKANTA MAJUMDAR:

Will the Minister of TOURISM be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of Centrally Sponsored Schemes and Central Sector Schemes being implemented in the State of West Bengal during the last four years and the current year, year-wise, scheme-wise, district-wise including North and South Dinajpur districts;
- (b) the details of funds allocated, sanctioned, released and utilized for each of the above schemes during the last four years and the current year, year-wise, scheme-wise and district-wise;
- (c) the details of physical targets set and achieved while implementing the above schemes during the last five years and the current year, year-wise, scheme-wise, district-wise;
- (d) whether the Government has found any shortcomings while implementing the above schemes and if so, the details thereof including the steps taken to overcome those shortcomings; and
- (e) whether there is time and cost overrun of any of the above scheme and if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER

(a) to (e): The Ministry of Tourism under the Central Sector Schemes of 'Swadesh Darshan', 'National Mission on Pilgrimage Rejuvenation and Spiritual Heritage Augmentation Drive (PRASHAD)' and 'Assistance to Central Agencies for Tourism Infrastructure Development' provides financial assistance to State Governments/Union Territory Administrations/Central Agencies for the development of tourism-related infrastructure and facilities at various tourism destinations in the country including West Bengal.

The details of projects sanctioned, amount sanctioned, amount utilized along with their status under the above mentioned schemes in the State of West Bengal is given at Annexure.

The Ministry of Tourism monitors the physical progress of the sanctioned projects through field inspections and review meetings held periodically with the State Governments/Union Territory Administrations/Central Agencies from time to time and necessary steps are taken to address the issues. The Ministry of Tourism has now revamped its Swadesh Darshan Scheme as Swadesh Darshan 2.0 (SD2.0) with the objective to develop sustainable and responsible destinations following a tourist & destination centric approach.

There is no cost overrun in implementation of projects. The Ministry of Tourism revises the timelines for completion of projects based on the request received by the implementing agencies, review of progress made in the project, utilization of funds by implementing agencies etc.
