Things to do:

- ▶ Sightseeing: Walk through the many famous temples, see the hanging pillars, and the Monolithic Nandi Bull to admire ancient architecture.
- ▶ Explore: Stroll in the Jatayu Theme Park to get a sense of your historical surroundings. The state government and the people of the village, constructed a huge Bird structure named Jatayu (from Ramayana), reflecting the history of the place.
- ▶ **Birdwatching:** Visit the Veerapuram Bird Sanctuary, which is a short distance from the village and famous for the Siberian painted stork that migrates here every year.
- ▶ Souvenir shopping: Local shops help in economic sustainability by promoting handicrafts, textiles, and agricultural produce by putting them on sale for tourists.
- ▶ Participate: Attend the Lepakshi Festival, hosted on a grand scale to promote Telugu art, culture and traditions. It has on display traditional crafts, like handloom sarees and dress material, Etikoppaka toys, Kalamkari, Machilipatnam jewellery, wood carvings and wall panels.
- ▶ Cultural show: Watch traditional dance performances and musical recitals at the Lepakshi Festival.
- ▶ Local activities: Watch puppet shows, flower shows and other cultural events by local artistes at the amphitheatre built by the state government.
