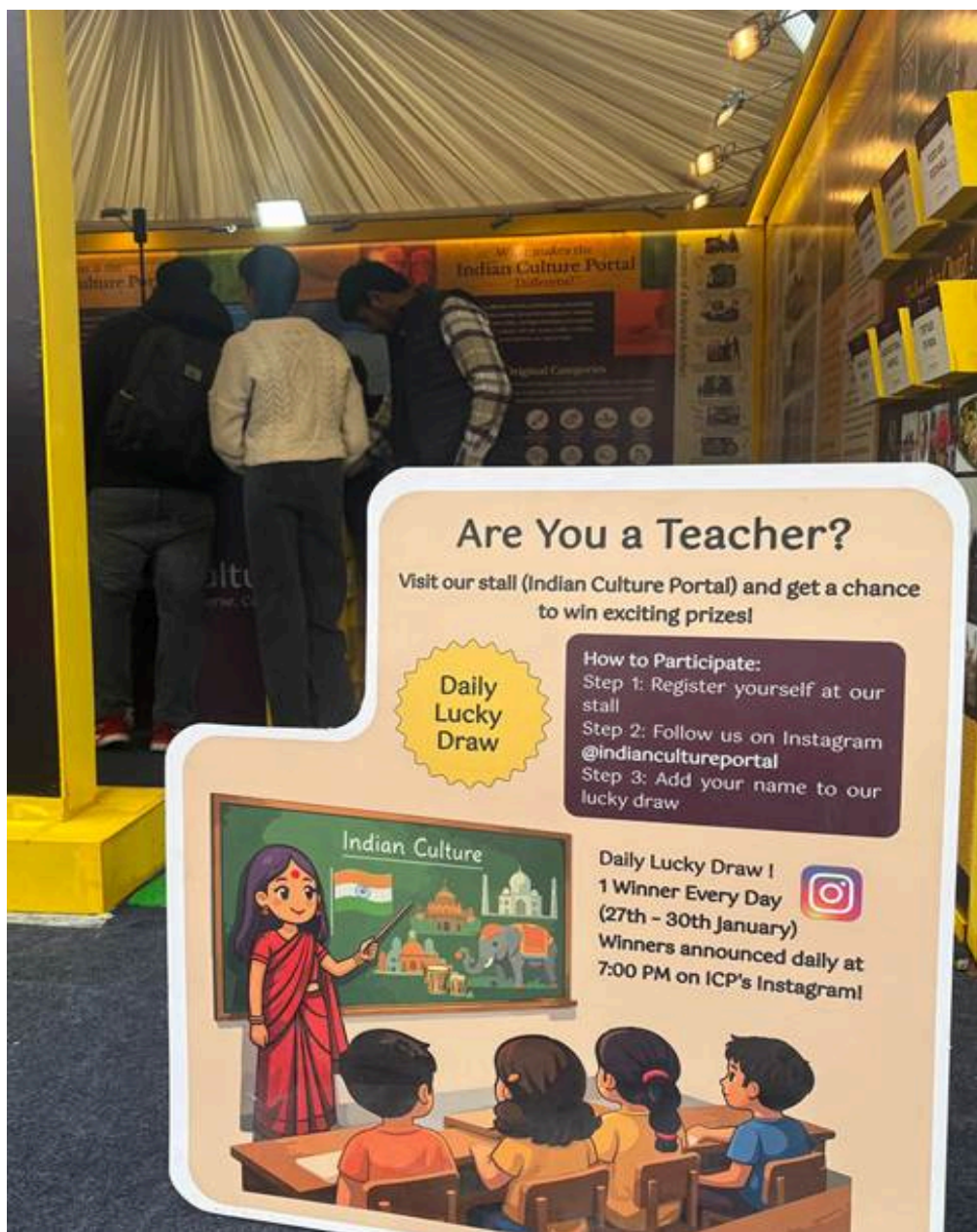
Indian Culture Portal Participates in Bharat Parv 2026 at Red Fort, Showcases India's Rich Cultural Heritage

Celebrating 1,000 Years of Resilience — tracing the history and reconstruction of the Shree Somnath Jyotirlinga Temple, symbolising India's enduring civilisational spirit

A quiz on Indian culture is being conducted, covering themes such as the freedom movement, shared heritage, festivals, music and dance traditions, architectural marvels, and the rich textile traditions of India.
